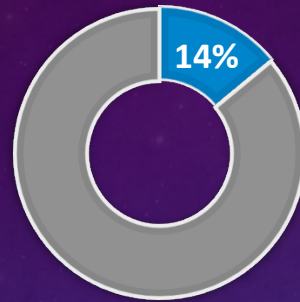


PUBLIC OPINION ON HEALTH SYSTEM SUSTAINABILITY: KEY STATS

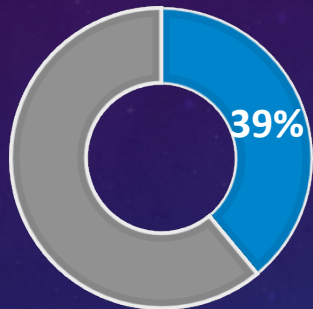
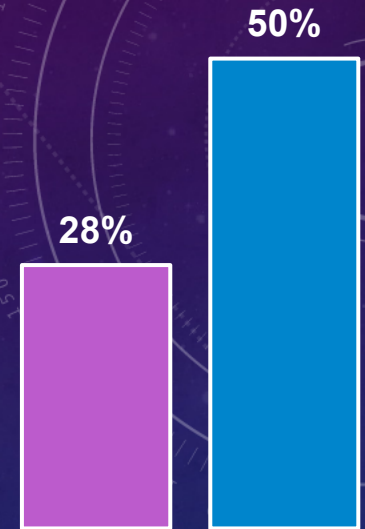

of all Ontarians, ensuring the sustainability of the health care system is a high priority...

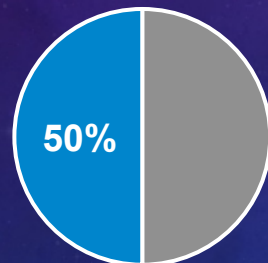


Only 14% of OCC members are confident in the sustainability of the Ontario health care system.*

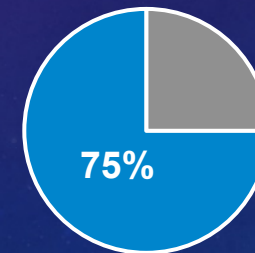
Ontarians are almost twice as likely to disagree (50%) that the provincial government has shown leadership on the health file, than to agree (28%).[†]



...But only 39% of Ontarians are very confident that Ontario's health care system is sustainable for the future.[†]



Half of all Ontarians agree that the health care system does not need more money, it just needs to be better managed.[†]



Three-quarters of Ontarians agree that the Ontario public health care system needs a renewed focus on patient outcomes for money spent.[†]

Today, only 16% of Ontarians say that the quality of health care in our province is "extremely high".[†]

[†]Survey of n=1004 Ontarians conducted by The Gandalf Group between December 28th, 2016 and January 3rd 2017. A random probability sample of this size has a margin of error of +/- 3.1%, 19 times out of 20.
